What is Point-In-Time Count?





- O1 The Point In Time (PIT)
 Count is a crucial annual survey.
- This federally mandated count is conducted every year in late January.

O3 It provides a one-night snapshot of people experiencing homelessness.

The count includes;

Sheltered Homeless Situations


- Emergency Shelter
- Transitional Housing

Unsheltered Homeless Situations

- Streets
- Parks
- Camping
- Vehicles (including RVs without utility hook-ups)

Who conducts the Count?





- The count relies on dedicated volunteers and staff
- Teams interview people experiencing homelessness directly
- Trained volunteers administer a standardized survey tool
- Results inform decisions about housing and services

PIT Count Government Help


- Data guides government policies and funding decisions
- Supports affordable housing and necessary support programs
- Informs allocation for homeless services and resources
- Provides essential insight for effective planning

2025 Statewide COC Data (Data Collected - Phone App)




The count also helps Local Homeless Councils locate individuals and families, assist them with outreach and to guide services for the community.
