Libertarian Party	04/18/2026	yes	Non-party members can vote in their primary.
Republican Party	04/25/2026	yes	Only registered members can vote in their primary.

Notes:

Per Utah Code, a political party is permitted to change their convention date. In that case they are required to notify the Office of the Lieutenant Governor within one business day (20A-8-402.5). Our office will notify you if any changes are submitted.

Even if a qualified political party is not planning on participating in the primary, if there is a race with 2 or more qualified candidates from the same party, a primary will be held (20A-9-409).

Qualified Political Party (QPP): All parties are considered QPP's for the 2026 Election Cycle
